Nine City School Principals Select the Fund's Professional Development Support for School Year 2010

As part of the City Schools' new Fair Student Funding Model, nine principals have selected the Fund's signature *Achievement First* literacy reform model for the 2009-2010 school year. *Achievement First* is a partnership between a school and the Fund to build the capacity of educators to improve student achievement. It is a research-driven and standards-based reform model that works closely with individual schools to support:

- Teachers in delivering engaging, differentiated literacy instruction; and
- Principals in providing effective instructional leadership; thereby
- Creating a Professional Learning Community that embodies a culture of collaboration and accountability to increase student performance.
